Restricted Areas are Clearly Labeled

A friend of ours recently shared a story about accidentally entering a bombing/explosives area offshore near Ocean City and being told to leave immediately.

Moments like that are exactly why we've improved how restricted areas appear in Argo. Clearly marked polygons now make it easier to spot restricted zones on the map before you enter them. If you do enter one by mistake you will receive the same alert you get when you tap on them.

Thomas and his family were out on Table Rock Lake with three small children when their pontoon started having issues and fuel ran low.

What began as a simple day on the water quickly turned into a stressful situation. They had pinned the boat ramp in Google Maps, but it kept trying to route them by road instead of water, leaving them disoriented on the lake.
